RE: PUBLIC MEETING

The Chairman opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence.

RE: PUBLIC HEARING – AMEND COUNTY CODE

Mr. Bart Svoboda, Zoning Administrator, reviewed the proposed amendment to Chapter 35, Article II of the Greene County Code to provide for an additional election district and to set new boundaries and supervisor terms for election districts.

The total number of registered voters in the proposed districts is as follows:

Ruckersville District	-	4554
Midway District	-	4528
Monroe District	-	4727
Stanardsville District	-	4588

Changes include updates in references to sections of the Code of Virginia, the designation of polling places and boundary descriptions for voting districts. Also, Section 35-55 – Supervisor(s) - was amended to reflect the change to one at-large supervisor and the election year for all five seats on the Board.

The floor was opened for public comment.

Mr. Troy Harlow requested the names of the polling places be changed to American Legion Post #128 and the Greene County Technical Education Center. He noted that Greene County has had three voting districts, Monroe, Ruckersville and Stanardsville, since 1870 and said he does not understand all the benefits of having four districts as opposed to three. Currently, everyone can vote for three members of the Board of Supervisors and School Board. The proposed amendment would change that to two members of each. Mr. Harlow felt four districts could limit candidates.

Mrs. Pauline Hovey expressed concern about the effect of the changes on Mr. Frydl and the potential of losing him as a member of the Board of Supervisors. She felt it is important to consider the incumbent and said Mr. Frydl is doing a great job and is a great asset. Mrs. Hovey asked the Board to consider this when making their decision. She also was concerned about losing an at large position and felt it will be difficult to find candidates to run for the Board of Supervisors and School Board.

Mr. Neil Williamson, resident of Ruckersville District and President of the Free Enterprise Forum, said he spoke at the work session about the level of confusion this plan was causing in the community. He noted the Albemarle County staff report regarding redistricting guidelines stated that preserving incumbency is one of several "traditional redistricting principles" recognized by the United States Supreme Court and serves to protect the voters from being removed from a representative they have elected and with whom they have a constituent relationship. Another issue touched on at the last meeting is respect for voter intent. Mr. Williamson said he is hopeful the Board will provide the voters the opportunity to vote Mr. Frydl out of office rather than unilaterally redistricting and removing voters from that opportunity. He suggested Ruckersville East and Ruckersville West as district names.

The public hearing was closed as there were no further comments.

Mr. Schmitt said the four districts and one at-large approach seems to have the largest amount of support. He expressed some concerns as mentioned here today and noted Albemarle County is all districts while Madison County is all at-large. If the County moves to four districts and one at-large representative now, the State will pay for all notifications that have to be sent. The County will also have to establish another polling place and right now identical voting machines can be purchased until July, 2012. This change will position the County well for the long haul.

Mr. Schmitt said he believed four and one is the way to go. The Board will have to settle the issue of district names and election dates. He would prefer to have Midway with a 2013 election date in order to preserve Mr. Frydl's seat. He questioned continuing to call the other district Ruckersville even though both are essentially new districts. He suggested changing the names of both districts to Midway and Seminole. Two new names may reduce the confusion. Mr. Schmitt said he was in favor of four and one with renaming both districts.

Mr. Peyton agreed with the four and one option noting it is the most cost effective and the timing is right. He felt the County will benefit greatly by taking this opportunity to reform districts and said we couldn't get a better match for number of voters in each district. Mr. Peyton said he believes most voters are "smarter than we are" and felt confusion about the Ruckersville District will be minimal. The Electoral Board will send every registered voter a card indicating which district they are in and the location of the polling place. One concern is the lack of

participation in the community. Mr. Peyton said he favors four and one with the names Ruckersville, Midway, Monroe and Stanardsville.

Mr. Skeens agreed and thanked Mrs. Shifflett, Registrar, and the members of the Electoral Board as well as Mr. Svoboda for their work on this project. He said he likes the Midway and Seminole names.

Mr. Frydl said the reality is that everyone in the room would like to stay with three districts if possible but the population has grown and that is really not feasible. If the County stayed with three districts, a new voting precinct would be required almost immediately. As far as having districts or all at-large members, Mr. Frydl said he had not received a lot of great feedback. He felt an all at-large membership could discourage individuals from running. Mr. Frydl said he likes the Ruckersville and Midway names. The reality is there are really four new districts because the lines have been changed. Originally, the thought was the names had a large effect on where the election could be held but the Board discovered that the election can be in whichever district they choose. Mr. Frydl said he didn't know, at this point, if he will run for re-election but does not want to be the only person in the County not allowed to run because he was willing to serve.

Mr. Frydl said the definition of gerrymandering is a practice that attempts to establish a political advantage for a particular party or group by manipulating geographic boundaries. We don't run by party in Greene County and the boundaries have been manipulated because of population reasons.

Mr. Catalano said he agreed with pretty much everything said and did not have a problem with the Midway District having a 2013 election. He said the four district option is going to happen so the County should go ahead with it. He said he would not change the Ruckersville District name and was good with Midway.

Upon motion by Carl Schmitt and unanimous vote, the Board approved the amendments to the Greene County Code, Chapter 35 (Elections), Article II, Section 35-(51-56) regarding the redistricting of magisterial districts with the following revisions: (See Attachment "A")

RE: OTHER MATTERS FROM THE BOARD

CENTRAL VIRGINIA REGIONAL JAIL

Mr. Peyton said the proposed \$17 million expansion program will be coming before the Board soon. Of that amount, 50% will be reimbursed by the State (\$8.5 million). The Jail Board will contribute \$6 million from the construction fund and localities will be responsible for the remaining \$2.5 million. Of that amount, Greene County's share will be 15.43% or \$385,750. Mr. Aylor, Superintendent, will attend a meeting to discuss the expansion project. This amount is in addition to the regular contribution and will be needed within three years.

BALANCE SHEET

Mr. Peyton said the balance sheet indicates the County is financially stable. The total debt for water and sewer is \$39,663,000. Additional debt carried is around \$2.5 million and includes projects such as air packs for fire departments, courthouse renovations, school bus program, library, vehicle maintenance program and debt on buildings. Mr. Peyton noted the County paid \$275,000 cash for conservation measures for county buildings. The Schools cost was \$2.6 million for conservation measures and \$5.3 million for the school expansion project.

Mr. Peyton also said the Board needs to reach an agreement on "earmarking" funds for the water impoundment project.

COMMUNITY PARK

Mr. Schmitt said a groundbreaking ceremony was held for the comfort/concession station at the Community Park. Construction will start tomorrow and should be completed within 90 days. The County will be installing the well/septic system and doing the dirt work around the building to complete the project.

Mr. Schmitt noted \$20,000 from the tree cutting at the Park has been set aside for this project in the budget.

ROUTE 29 BYPASS

Mr. Schmitt said the Route 29 bypass project, which runs from Route 250 at Barracks Road to south of Hollymead Town Center, was discussed at a recent meeting of the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors and there has been a shift in policy. There has been talk of extending the road north. Mr. Schmitt suggested Greene County keep an eye on this project.

DEBT

Mr. Frydl said the debt for water and sewer projects (\$39,663,000) is a fee based debt and the majority of costs should be borne through fee base. The remaining debt (\$2.4 million) is solely payable by tax money.

RRBC BOARD

Mr. Frydl and Mr. Schmitt attended a meeting of the Rivanna River Basin Commission. We are far ahead of other regions in the State in understanding the health of our rivers and how that will tie into the TMDL process and determining how to meet the TMDL or if TMDL will have any impact on our community. The data will allow us to make decisions based on cost and effectiveness as far as health of our rivers.

SCHOOL BOARD

Mr. Frydl noted there will be a change in leadership of the School Board with the election of a new chairperson at their next meeting. He also said the Schools have been trying to complete a salary scale adjustment and this has been accomplished for teachers this year.

COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE

Mr. Frydl expressed concern about the lack of response from the Commissioner of Revenue regarding reports. The Board of Supervisors has made multiple requests for basic reports to find out what exactly is happening as to changes in businesses, etc. The Board is trying to fulfill its due diligence on behalf of taxpayers but is getting no response to requests. He said it is impossible to provide oversight without reports that are the duty of that constitutional officer and noted the new Treasurer has complied with requests for reports. He felt this situation will need to be monitored.

RETIREMENT

Mr. Skeens announced the he retired, five (5) days ago, from his position with the Greene County School System.

CANCELLED MEETING

The Chairman announced that the meeting scheduled for June 28 has been cancelled. The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be held on July 12.

PVCC LETTER

It was the consensus of the Board to approve a letter in support of the application by Piedmont Virginia Community College for a grant under the 2011 Rural Business Enterprise Grant Program. (See Attachment "B")

PARK RECOGNITION

The Chairman requested staff to draft resolutions for individuals/families who have donated over \$10,000 to the Community Park Project for consideration at the next meeting.



ELECTIONS

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL (RESERVED)

Secs. 35.1-----35.50. Reserved.

ARTICLE II. BOUNDARY LINES OF ELECTION DISTRICTS

Sec. 35-51. Authority

Pursuant to authority contained in Code of Virginia §§ 15.2-1211 and subject to 24.2-3041, the election districts and their respective polling places for Greene County, Virginia, are hereby created and established as set forth in this article.

Sec. 35-52. Magisterial districts

The Magisterial Districts of Greene County, with boundary lines and names thereof respectively as constituted and known on the day before this article takes effect, shall remain the same, but representation of the governing body shall be by election districts hereinafter described.

Sec. 35-54. Boundaries of election districts

Following State Route 619 (Dundee Road) in a southern direction to its intersection with State Route 609 (Fredericksburg Road), following State Route 609 in a westerly direction for approximately 0.07 miles to the intersection of an old road heading south along boundary of Census Block 2078 until the intersection with State Route 640 (Watson Road), following State Route 640 South until the intersection with State Route 633 (Dairy Road) following State Route

Monroe Election District-Dyke Precinct

Beginning at the intersection of the Greene-Albemarle County line and State Route 603 (Bingham Mountain Road) and following State Route 603 in a northern direction to its intersection with State Route 633 (Amicus Road), following State Route 633 in a eastern direction to its intersection with State Route 624 (Beazley Road), following State Route 624 in a northwestern direction to its intersection with State Route 622 (Celt Road), following State Route 622 in a northwestern direction to its intersection with State Route 624 (Pea Ridge Road), following State Route 624 in a northwestern direction to its intersection with State Route 646 (Garth Road), following State Route 646 in a western direction to its intersection with State Route 810 (Dyke Road), following State Route 810 (Dyke Road) in a southwestern direction to its intersection with State Route 626 (Snow Mountain Road), following State Route 626 in a

Following Deep Run west for 0.92 miles until reaching the border of Census Block 3020. Following the border between Census Block 3020 and 3018 northwest for 0.23 miles until reaching a waterway at the border of Census Block 3002. Following the waterway at the border of Census Block 3018 and 3002 northeast for 1.01 miles, following in the southern-most fork of the waterway, until the point at which the waterway separates from the border of Census Block 3002. Following the border of Census Block 3002 and 3015 north, then

Sec. 35-55. Supervisor(s).

One supervisor shall be elected from each election district established by this article. One supervisor shall be elected from the county at-large. Elected supervisors shall serve four-year terms and may seek re-election to additional four-year terms. Election for supervisors shall be as follows:

Year 2013 - Midway District, Stanardsville District.

Year 2011 - Monroe District, Ruckersville District, 1 At-Large Seat

At the end of each term, an election for the expired term shall be held.

Sec. 35-56. Election district and/or polling place change.

The secretary of the electoral board shall notify by mail no later than 15 days prior to the next general, special, or primary election, all registered voters whose election district and/or polling places have been changed by the provisions of this article.

Sec. 35-57. Central Absentee Voter Precinct

- (a) **Purpose.** The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide a Central Absentee Voter Precinct (CAP) for the orderly processing of absentee ballots for all elections, federal, state and local, held in the County, and to comply with the provisions of the Help America Vote Act.
- (b) **Location.** The CAP shall be located in the Greene County Courthouse Complex located at 22 Court Street, Stanardsville, Virginia 22973.

- (c) Operation. The CAP shall be operated and controlled by the Electoral Board, and shall receive, count and record absentee ballots cast in the County, as provided by law.
